EGPS ONE-YEAR TRAINING PROGRAM IN GROUP PSYCHOTHERAPY

The EGPS One-Year Training Program is a concentrated, psychodynamically oriented training program designed to accommodate therapists in clinics, agencies, and private practice. The program offers a group experience, consultation, and seminars that integrate concepts in group psychotherapy and practice. The training is structured to provide a foundation of competence in conducting both long-term and time-limited group therapy. The faculty is composed of senior members of the Eastern Group Psychotherapy Society and the American Group Psychotherapy Association. A certificate is awarded upon completion of the program. The Training Program is designed to meet the educational and partial supervisory requirements for inclusion in The National Registry of Certified Group Psychotherapists.

Structure

The academic year is divided into ten-week trimesters. Each trimester includes three modules:

- Group Consultation ■ Group Theory
- Group Experience

The Program

Group Consultation: 5:00-6:30pm

An essential aspect of the program is consultation, that focuses on the groups you conduct. Depending upon availability, alternate times or consultation may be arranged in September. Students are expected to begin conducting a therapy group by the second trimester. Each student is responsible for obtaining her/his own group to lead.

Group Theory: 6:45-7:45pm

This seminar integrates the principles and applications of psychodynamic group psychotherapy. Course content includes: private practice/agency issues, patient selection, composition, pre-group preparation, transference and countertransference, the group leader, theoretical perspectives, therapeutic techniques, group process, group dynamics, and termination.

Group Experience: 8:00-9:30pm

Students participate in a training group experience in which they learn the basics of group leadership and group dynamics through their direct experience.

Schedule

The full program: group consultation, seminars, and the group experience is conducted on Wednesdays from 5:00-9:30pm.

Tuition

The fee for the One-Year Training Program, including consultation, seminars, and the group experience is \$875 per trimester. It is payable at the beginning of each trimester. Individual courses and trimesters in the One-Year Program may not be taken separately.

Scholarships

Partial scholarships are available to qualified applicants.

Eligibility and Application

Open to all who hold a minimum of a Masters Degree in a mental health profession. Applicants will be interviewed by at least one member of the faculty. Our rolling admissions process allows us to admit qualified applicants throughout the year. Upon receipt and processing of your application, you will be contacted for an interview.
